"His thirst to enhance the student experience of witnessing Christ in their lives speaks to the mission of Mater Dei." Jenkins' vocation as a Holy Cross priest is grounded in being a teacher of our Catholic faith. The rich tradition of the Holy Cross as educators and influencers is well understood. Moreover, I'm equally enthusiastic to drive its growth, which will be built upon that well-established goodness and success Mater Dei is known for nationwide." Father holds a bachelor's degree in government from King's College. He received his Master of Divinity from the University of Notre Dame and his doctorate in Catholic school leadership from the University of San Francisco. Father Jenkins currently resides in South Bend, Ind., and will be relocating to Southern California to assume his new role. He will also serve as a priest-in-residence with the Diocese of Orange.
